## Golf: Lady Panthers pour it on at Area Tournament

### Union County claims the Area 3 championship by 30 strokes at Old Union

Union County may reside in a new region and classification, but the girls golf team continues to produce the same old results.

Last Tuesday morning, Union hosted the Area 3 Tournament at Old Union Golf Course and proceeded to run away from second place Franklin County by 30 strokes (254-284).

Despite thundershowers passing through the area on Monday afternoon, and overnight, the greens remained firm and quick when play opened at 9:30 a.m. And coupled with increasing winds throughout the morning and early afternoon, a score in the mid-80s would keep one in contention for Low Medalist.

Union County junior Grace Wischmeyer and Dawson County's Sydney Morgan each paced the field with an 83 to share Low Medalist honors.

One stroke behind them was Lady Panthers' junior Ally Horinek with an 84.

Rounding out Union's day was fellow junior Megan Rowe, who finished four back of the leaders with an 87, and senior Maddy Horinek, who fired a 91.

One back of the leaders was Hart County's Natalie Sanford, who tied Ally Horinek for third in the individual standings.

Hart County came in third in the team standings with a 288 - four shots behind Franklin County.

Rowe's 87 was good enough for a top five finish, while Maddy Horinek came in seventh at 91.

Rounding out the team standings was fourth place Dawson County - 306; fifth place Lumpkin County - 328; and sixth place North Hall - 332.

Jackson County placed seventh with a 341; Morgan County was eighth at 345; East Jackson's 372 resulted in a ninth place finish; and Greater Atlanta Christian was 10th at 378.

In 11th was Monroe Area with a 423. Fannin County only sent two individuals - not enough to compete for the team title.

After consecutive seasons of placing third in state, Union gets another crack at that elusive team State Championship.

UCHS has won multiple individual state titles, including golf (Jamie Gibson in 1990) but have yet to claim a team championship in any sport.

The Class AAA Girls State Tournament is scheduled for a two-day, 36-hole tournament on May 22 and 23rd at Okefenokee Country Club in Blakeshear (Pierce County).

This year will mark the first time that the state finals will be a 36-hole tournament, instead of 18.
